Motivation letter

Here are a few points and questions that may help you in preparing your motivation letter (1-2 pages):

Letterhead (name, address, email)

- Introducing yourself (name, university degree and subject, personal background ...)
- What is your envisaged study programme or project and why did you chose it? Why you want to study in Germany/Lebanon/Jordan?
- What academic and professional experiences have been particularly important for you?
- What objectives do you have with regard to your academic/professional future?
- How is the proposed study project embedded in your future scientific and professional plans?
- What religious, social or cultural commitments and activities are you involved in?
- Why you apply for a scholarship to a Catholic Church organization?

Church recommendation letter

It is important that the applicant's religious and social commitment is described and documented in detail, not just in general terms. A recommendation letter ideally gives answers to the following questions:

- When did you meet the applicant for the first time? Did you recently have the chance to meet with him/her or have a conversation over the phone?
- Which church-related, social or cultural activities has the applicant been involved in?
- In which functions has he/she served the church, church-related institutions or projects, or social and cultural associations?
- Does he/she have any experiences in the field of interreligious dialogue?
- What are the personal strengths of the applicant that the community as benefited from in the past?
- In what ways will a study visit to Germany/Lebanon/Jordan (supported by a catholic scholarship programme) help to develop these strengths?
